

Gen's-Day.


Hello everyone, Well in August it will be a year since you voted in the QuIVAA constitution. This has meant that we have a legal structure to work from.

Our aim is not to stop people from using drugs but to educate them on safe administration of drugs. Prevention is best when we have no cure for HIV.

So safe sex and safe needle use is all we can do to prevent of the Aids virus.

So 1f you wish to become involved with Dart News, do not hesitate to do so.





Education at QuIVAA



HEPATITIS AND OTHER THINGS

In past issues of DART NEWS much has been said about HIV but not much has been said about other blood borne infections and other viruses spread through sharing and dirty hits. Some of these viruses are just as devastating and can be more contagious than HIV.

Perhaps the most devastating these are three strains of hepatitis. Hepatitis B is highly infectious and according to the Chairman of the National Health and Medica1 Research Council's Committee on Communicable Diseases, Professor Clem Broughton, 'Hepatitis B is potentially a more serious public health risk than than HIV.'

Hepatitis B, like HIV is a viral infection but however attacks the liver rather than the immune system. The virus can also be transmitted sexually and it can act as a trigger for cancer of the liver in some cases. Anyway, the patient is often laid up several months for convalescence and may become a carrier. A vaccine is available.

Two other forms of Hepatitis exist. The first, Hepatitis C, once referred to as Non A/Non Hepatitis is less common than Hep B but never the less the strain is just as serious and damages the liver.

The other strain of Hepatitis which could affect IV users is known as Delta Hepatitis. This strain can only be contracted if person has already Hepatitis, rather like getting a double dose of the flu. However the victim suffers a long period of illness and the disease almost always results in death through a total break down of the liver.

A number of blood infections can result through unsafe needle and syringe use. These can make you very sick.

Septicaemia can be caused by a dirty hit where by bacteria has mixed with blood resulting in acute fever, sweating, rigors and a rapid rise in temperature. Endocarditis, infection which effects heart caused by the use of old lemons and stale vinegar used for dissolving substances.

Poor needle hygiene may led to other complications such as skin ulcers and lesions in particular a condition known as sinus where by a unhealed passage leads to abscess under the skin.

In addition, according to the Albion st.(HIV)clinic in Sydney there is a high degree of S.T.D infection amongst IV users with more than 21% of those interviewed reporting a history of more than one sexually transmitted disease. Almost half (49.9%) reported that they have had contracted at least one S.T.D.

HIV is not the only thing one can pick up through unsafe sex and syringe use. Its O.K to have fun but remember to be careful. Always use a clean fit, use a clean spoon, filter and water and don't share them. When in romance, love safely.

If you would like to know more, QUIVAA conducts workshops usually on Friday afternoons and they are fun. Contact Colin, B.J or Mark at QUIVAA by phoning 844 7440.

PROJECT NOCTURN HAS GONE STATE-WIDE!!!!

Yes every one Project Nocturn has gone statewide!! As part of the national campaign (which is all those ads you've seen on T.V. about AIDS and needle and syringe use and safe sex) Project Nocturn is being done in Townsville, Cairns, Sunshine Coast and the Gold Coast. This is good for all the users that get the information and good for QuIVAA because it a recognition of our project being a good one.

For those of you who don't know what Project Nocturn is: it is a project where we go into night clubs and give out condoms and information about AIDS prevention. QuIVAA does this project about three times per month. It aims to get to users that aren't members of QuIVAA and that need the information we can provide.

Project Nocturn is run by volunteer workers and Janine a staff member of QuIVAA. We book the clubs and hotels that we know users hang out at. We then organise for 3 or 4 volunteers to attend with Janine. We go out at the time most suitable to the club, that being when they are busiest.

Project Nocturn is an area that we need more help with at QuIVAA. There are a variety of ways you can help. These include:

- 1. You can tell us of pubs and clubs that you know that users go to regularly. You can do this by phoning Janine or Genevieve at QuIVAA on 844 7440.
- 2. You can join the Project Nocturn team. This can be by helping us put together all the information needed for the Project Nocturns or by being one of the volunteers that do Project Nocturn.

If you do want to be a volunteer with Project Nocturn we will give you all the training you will need. This includes: an AIDS workshop that gives all the answers to questions you are likely to be asked. You will also be given a workshop on Project Nocturn. This covers stuff like role plays of approaching people and other good stuff about how to do Project Nocturn. All your questions will be worked on and answered before you go out.

At the first Project Nocturn will not be expected to you approach anyone but you can just the time with another volunteer worker or Janine until you feel confident about approaching people yourself. We will not send you to clubs that you don't feel comfortable in.

If you like music, nightclubs and people, then come along and have a great time talking to lots of different people, and do your bit to help people understand more about safe sex and safe needle cleaning practices. O.K. All you women out there, I need your help! I want to even the team up, at the moment the guys out number women 5 to 1. So all you night owls, male and female, if you want to join our possum patrol, DO IT NOW!!!!

Project Nocturn is an incredibly good way of getting to users. If we want to prevent the spread of the virus we have to get to the people like recreational users and make sure we reach them by going to places where they are likely to be.By doing this, we can also make them aware of services available to them, like QuIVAA.

A Legal Seminar was held by S.Q.W.I.S.I. on the 9th of June 1990 Titled

"Prostitution Industry or Crime" The keynote speakers were , Ms Kris Anderson, Co-ordinator & spokesperson for S.O.W.I.S.I., Professor Marcia Neave, from the University of Adelaide, Ms Bebe Loff, Health Dept of Victoria, Di Soon local Brisbane Solicitor, Mr Andrew Hunter from the SCARLET Alliance, Ms Cheryl Overs, founding member of the Victorian Prostitutes Collective and now residing in Paris, France. Ms Chris Richards from the Criminal Justice Commission and our own Kate Goodwin from S.Q.W.I.S.I. The seminar had an interesting flavour as there were representatives from the C.J.C. , the Brisbane Health Dept & concerned people ranging from the Gold Coast to Cairns.Oh! I forgot of course there was the ever ready presents of the now Famous or Infamous Brisbane Licencing Branch who saw fit to hang around the carpark sight seeing for awhile. One was adventerous in attending the seminar. We hope he now has a human side to him and can see what a victimless crime prostitution is. The most positive out come was our ressolution which was unanimously accepted by all parties present (Licencing Branch member did'nt object) and reads as follows-:

- 1. This meeting condemns the increased allocation of police resources to arrest and harass workers involved in the sex industry especially at a time when the Criminal Justice Commission is inviting public submissions on its research papers into prostitution law.
- 2. This meeting views with concern increased police arrest of sex industry workers as a deliberate attempt to take control of the debate relating to prostitution law change.
- 3. This meeting calls on the Minister for Police and the Commissioner for Police to grant an amnesty for charges of prostitutuion related offences to ensure that those involved in the sex industry can contribute to the law reform debate.
- 4. This meeting calls on Police Minister, Mr Terry Mackenroth to immediately make public any directions he may have given to Police Commissioner Newham on prostitution law enforcement pursuant to recently enacted Police Service Administration Act while law changes in this area are actively under Community consideration.

We wish to thank all Quivva members for their support when we need it

MUFFINS

2 cups Quick oats
2 cups butter-milk

Soak the mixture overnight.

2 eggs
1 cup of brown sugar
1 cup of oil

Wisk and add to the mixture above.

2 cups of wheat flour
1/2 tsp of salt
1 tsp of soda
1/2 tsp of cinammon
2 tsp baking soda

Sift_then add dries to the wet mixture.

Then fold in walnuts, bananas and sultanas.

Pre-heat oven to very hot 230 degrees C (gas 450 F). Lightly grease 36-40 muffin tins with a little butter and sprinkle lightly with flour (shaking out any excess). Spoon the mixture into a prepared muffin-tin and bake for 15 minutes, do the skewer test. Cool in tins for about 5 minutes. serve warm. Yummy?
